Images from the walk to the waymarker tree.



Looking towards Dixon Heights, from alongside the A590, with an obvious significant tower on the summit ... whereas the battlemented ruin you seek is within the woodland on the left (northwestern) flanks.



The faint trod brings you to the arched doorway through old stonework. Only now can the figurative tree AW drew – an elegant Scots pine – be seen in its true context.



The ruined battlements are difficult to see from the same location AW stood, though it's easy to feel the same impression as shown in his original sketch.



Left: the Scots pine, seen from looking back through the archway; and *right*: standing some distance below the ruin, while hard to see today from AW's original perspective, it shows the reality of the scene.
