Images from the walk to the waymarker tree.



Approached from below, there may be some uncertainty as to whether this could be the waymarker rowan. It is, however ... given the location, the low crag and the absence of other trees in the vicinity.



From above the rowan, looking down to the lakeside campsite on Buttermere's northern shore, with Comb Beck opposite spilling from Burtness Comb above and the whole High Stile range on display. The three holly trees in Red Pike (B) 7 (BOOK SEVEN) are clearly seen northwest from this point (though not in this image) near the edge of Crummock Water, on the rising ground below Blea Crag.



A tree with character, a survivor in a tight spot – however described, it continues to waymark the ascent path and probably has several more good years ahead.
