

8.6 Top o' Selside (page 96)

Images from the walk to the waymarker tree.



The diminutive waymarker holly tree (at centre) seen across the open upland, from the 748' summit (referred to as Brock Barrow on OS OL6/7). The next cairn and ruin mentioned by AW are seen some 100 metres to the tree's left, on a low rocky rise. The Coniston Fells fill the northwest horizon beyond Coniston Water, with the slopes of Top o' Selside in the far northwards distance.



The rock-strewn summit of Brock Barrow is 200m away to the left – and, just along and right, over the broken stone wall, the 'next cairn' sits on a low rock mound with the dilapidated ruin nearby.



A waymarker of simple beauty, steadfastly confirming a walker's bearing and direction to Low Light Haw and High Light Haw, thence Top o' Selside in a wide open featureless landscape.
